The UAE marks World Health Day on Monday. This year, the World Health Organisation (WHO) launched a global campaign titled "Healthy Beginnings, Hopeful Futures". The campaign aims to encourage governments and the global health community to intensify efforts to eliminate preventable maternal and newborn deaths. According to the WHO, approximately 300,000 women around the world die annually due to pregnancy or childbirth-related complications. In addition, more than two million infants die within the first month of life, while around two million others are stillborn each year.

World Health Day provides an opportunity to spotlight the UAE's significant achievements in delivering high-quality healthcare services that help reduce health risks for mothers and newborns.

In 2024, the UAE launched the national policy for the promotion of women's health, which outlines healthcare requirements for women throughout the various stages of life, including during the reproductive years. The UAE offers one of the world's leading maternal healthcare systems. It begins with premarital medical screenings, continues with regular prenatal care to ensure the health and development of both mother and baby, and extends through childbirth services and breastfeeding education.

The MoU was signed by Mohamed Hassan Alsuwaidi, UAE Minister of Investment, Vikram Misri, the Foreign Secretary of India, and KTM. Udayanga Hemapala, Secretary of the Ministry of Energy of Sri Lanka.
